Connecting to the two new cell towers at Pelorus Bridge and Canvastown

As with all new RCG (RBI2) towers, both these towers are 4g only, which means only phones capable of VoLTE (Voice over Long Term Evolution) calling are able to make/receive calls while connected to these towers.

If your phone is capable of VoLTE calling you will need to make sure your phone is updated with the latest software and turn on VoLTE calling in your mobile network settings.

Once activated, a VoLTE symbol will appear at the top of your phone next to the signal strength bars, you should now be able to make and receive calls!

HISTORY REPEATS PANDEMIC SPANISH FLU 1917/1918

The influenza was thought to come back to NZ on the troop ship 'Niagara', it was raging overseas, especially amongst the troops.

At the height of the epidemic in NZ, in November for two to three weeks ordinary life was impossible. Shops, offices and factories shut down without enough staff to keep them going. Schools, hotels and theatres were closed by order of the Government.

Because shipping from port to port around in NZ came to a halt, many towns suffered from a shortage of supplies, such as flour and coal.

In some places it became impossible to hold proper funeral services for the victims of the influenza. Many undertakers and grave diggers were ill, and the number of victims too great to deal with. Coffins were made by volunteers. By December the worst of the epidemic was over, and many of the ill began to recover.

The official total of deaths was (including troops from overseas) 8753 from a population of 1,150,509.

In Canvastown, the flu patients were taken to the Debating Hall, which was in the School grounds.

I have kept a diary during our Pandemic Lockdown for the Marlborough Museum, for historical purposes which in the future can be used as local history. Mum (Lois Rush) could remember the Spanish Flu.
